## **Club Happenings:**

A lively conversation was started by Bill N4IQ about the new FT-8 RU. Bill gave out some good advice on setup for this contest and recommended that you use the JTAlert software which integrates with WSJT-X and, if setup properly, will identify dupes, new stations, new state and country multipliers, and stations calling CQ. The software also logs directly into N1MM which helps with multiplier IDing, scoring, and dupes.

Tom W1TEF filled us in with the saga of the OM trying to dip his toes into the swirling waters of the digital world. Tom had some issues trying to set up for FT-8, and his way of telling the story is quite humorous to say the least. I think we all can relate in one fashion or another about the difficulties of trying to get

your rig to communicate with any of the digital software programs floating around the internet. In the end, he got some help from a couple of our members so hopefully he got things working, perhaps you could fill us in Tom?

We had a really good turnout for the ARRL 10 meter contest this year. Band conditions were surprisingly good on Friday night and Saturday, but a complete dud on Sunday.

As a group experiment, Frank KG4IGC tried out the chat room abilities that are included with groups.io. for the first time. This worked out well, is accessible to all of our members and will be set up for future contests. This will come in handy not only for seeing how your team-mates are doing in the contest, but also for such things as reporting band openings. Please remember the rules of each contest about things like self spotting and giving out frequencies for mults if you decide to join in the chats.

Dave WN4AFP asked a general question "If I have my AGC in the off position, will my neighbor (K4YYL) who sports a 150' tower and is running 10,000 watts?" {Just kidding folks...ed.} blow up my front end? The reason for the question is because Dave is having trouble hearing weak stations when his neighbor is transmitting. The general consensus was that Dave's front end should be OK if his signal meter is only reporting 40-60db.

Frank KG4IGC introduced our newest member Kevan Broughton K4KWB who is from Ladson, SC.

Tom W1TEF let everyone know about a page that he found on the ARRL website where you can download certificates from past years contests. The page can be found here, a few of our members found certificates that they were not aware of that they had been awarded.

Bill N4IQ let the club know that the <u>FT-8 RU results</u> have been posted.

Dave WN4AFP gave a contesting tip on how to maximize your score in a mixed mode contest that used both SSB and CW: "RUN on CW and use phone to get those missing multipliers. By doing this you will maximize your QSO points and multipliers. If you are in a contest in which multipliers are by mode, then using this method, your score will grow even faster. Another advantage is that assisted players will find you via Reverse Beacon Network."

Frank KG4IGC asked the group what the category in the ARRL contests "Unlimited" meant. For example, (SO LP unlimited) The best answer came from Bill N4IQ, "Assisted - unlimited: means you can use spotting clusters, skimmers and the like. Also, if you use any form of multichannel decoder - i.e. Fldigi using psk and you are getting multi-channel decodes, or using WSJT-X and getting multichannel FT8 decodes - you are automatically classified as "assisted" or "unlimited". The two usually mean the same thing."

**Tables: Pre-registered** - \$10.00 per 8ft table.


At the door - \$12.00 per table, if available. Chairs \$2.00 each.

#### **Notice from Dave WN4AFP:**

As some of you have noticed, the SFOTA system experienced a 'gremlin' this week...Several members have reported missing and incorrect contest data. Thanks to our amazing SFOTA system designer, the system is working again, but we need each member to review their SFOTA data (contact totals) for each contest to make sure that their data is accurate and to make any corrections as needed.

The SFOTA system will allow members to correct any previous data entered into the system. The system will be closed for corrections after December 31st.

Here's the process for reviewing your data and how to make corrections:

- 1. Login to SFOTA
- 2. In the Leaderboard Overall Standings, CLICK ON YOUR CALLSIGN.
- 3. You will be on your "Contest Entries To Date" page. Review the data for each contest list and make a list of the corrections you need to make to your data.
- 4. In the right hand column, CLICK ON THE "LIST ALL EVENTS" LINK
- 5. You will now see a list of all the contests that have been created in the system for the year. To make a data/score correction on a special contest, CLICK ON THE NAME OF THE CONTEST.
- 6. You will now see a list of all the members who participated in specific contest along with their scores. TO CORRECT YOUR SCORE, ENTER THE

CORRECT SCORE IN THE FIELDS AT THE BOTTOM OF THE PAGE AND CLICK SUBMIT. After submitting your score, the leaderboard will be updated to reflect your corrections


